ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION	Regenerating our natural environment to support a rich and healthy ecosystem that supports us all to thrive: Animal Welfare (five domains of husbandry) and Human Welfare (achieved through caring for our natural environment)
MUSIC	Focus on music and instruments from Aotearoa
PERFORMING ARTS	A focus on Dance styles and Music that makes inspirational links to Aotearoa
VISUAL ART	Creating Art inspired by artists from Aotearoa
