ATTENDANCE

I expect 100% attendance! Your child **must** be at school every day. If your child is not able to come to school, make sure to **contact me in the morning**, preferably before 8:30am. I will be contacting you if your child is away without a valid reason as they cannot progress with their learning if they miss school. **We want and need your child at school every day!**

LATES

School starts at 8:30am, though we encourage arrival by 8:20am. Students who are **late twice in a week**, or **three times in a term**, will be assigned Community Service. A **fourth instance within a term will result in after-school detention**. If your child is late, please escort them into the school or provide a written note of explanation.

UNIFORM

Your child needs to be in 100% correct school uniform and this includes their whānau band. Refer to their MI Planner for more information. If there are any problems and your child does not have the correct uniform, please send them to school with **a note**. They can take this to Mr Peilua **to receive a uniform pass** for their incorrect uniform.
