Thank you all for your incredible, ongoing support. Let's make Term Three another amazing learning journey!

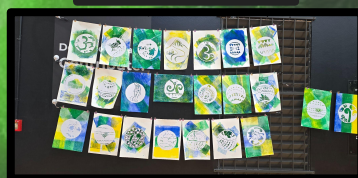

ATTENDANCE:

I expect 100% attendance! Your child must be at school every day. If your child is not able to come to school, make sure to contact me in the morning, preferably before 8:30am. LATES:
