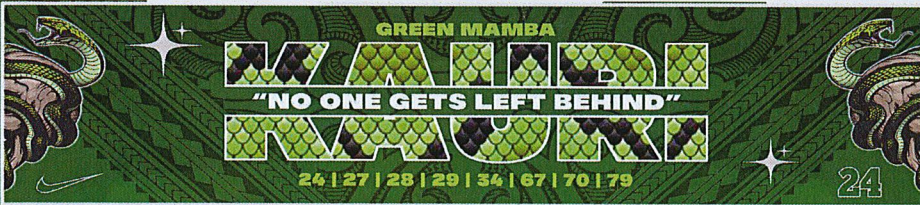

ATTENDANCE
