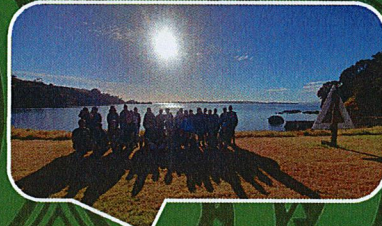
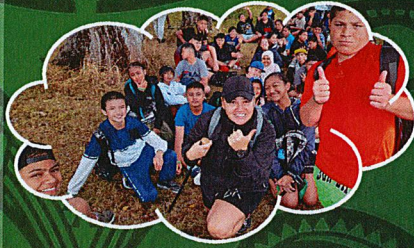
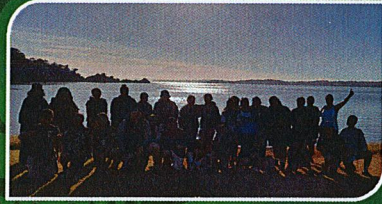
### Every Child Deserves the Experience of a Marae Stay!

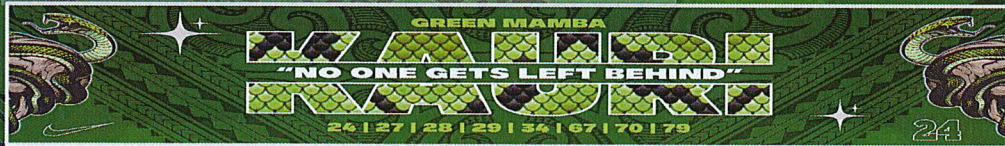

### ATTENDANCE
