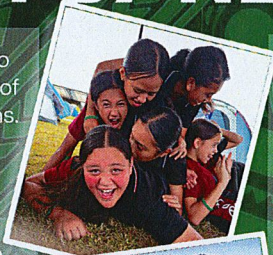

ROOM 67 NEWSLETTER



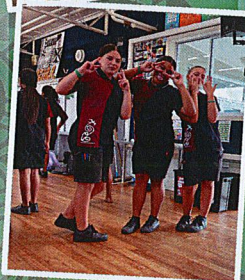

ATTENDANCE
